



Clothing List School Year 2009

Parents may allow their children to dress as they see fit however students' dress should always be in good taste and not reflect extremes of prevailing fashion. All articles of clothing must be marked with the student's name.

The following list is just a suggestion and will help you pack:

Boys

- 1 pair black polishable dress shoes
- 2 pairs running shoes
- 7 pairs socks casual and/or sweat socks
- 1 black or brown leather belt
- 1 pair hiking boots undershirts (number depends on preference)
- 8 pairs of underwear
- 3-4 casual shirts/tops (in keeping with school dress code)
- 2-3 pairs casual pants
- 1 pair "good casual" pants
- 1 "good casual" shirt
- 1 pair sweat pants
- 1-2 sweatshirts
- 2 sets of pajamas
- 2 towels & washcloths**
- 1 light jacket
- 1 winter jacket
- 1 pair winter gloves/mittens
- 1 winter hat
- 1 bathrobe
- 1 watch
- 2 warm coats or anoraks
- 1 raincoat
- 6 summer outfits (trousers, skirts, dresses, shirts, sweaters, T-shirts. etc.)
- 1 outfit for dinner / dance
- 1 swimsuit
- 1 tennis outfit (or shorts + T-shirts)
- 1 ski outfit (2nd term)
- 1 outfit for dinner / dance

Girls

- 1 pair dark brown polishable dress shoes (closed toe & closed heel)
- 2 pairs running shoes
- 5 pairs socks
- 2 pairs tights (winter)
- 7 pairs of casual and/or sweat socks
- 1 pair hiking boots
- 8 pairs of underwear
- 3-4 casual shirts/tops (in keeping with school dress code)
- 2-3 pairs casual pants
- 1 pair dress pants or skirt
- 1 "good casual" shirt or sweater
- 1 pair sweat pants
- 1-2 sweatshirts
- 2 sets of pajamas
- 2 towels & washcloths**
- 1 light jacket
- 1 winter jacket
- 1 pair winter gloves/mittens
- 1 winter hat
- 1 bathrobe
- 1 watch
- 2 warm coats or anoraks
- 1 raincoat
- 6 summer outfits (trousers, skirts, dresses, shirts, sweaters, T-shirts. etc.)

Following their arrival at school, students will receive their sports clothing, comprising shorts, T-shirt and track suit. As they are not included in the fees, these items will be charged separately on account.

Clothes **must** have labels sewn in or they must be marked with a laundry pen. Labels are preferred, as they last longer. It is also useful to send a laundry pen with your child so he/she can mark any new clothes purchased during the school year. School cannot be responsible for lost items, so it is imperative that all personal items be properly identified. There is a Lost and Found area and attempts are made to find lost items. If articles are not labeled properly, it makes it very difficult to return lost items to their owners.



Students wear casual clothing after school, on special school days, to most dinners and on weekends, so boarders will want to bring along their casual clothes. The Student Handbook goes into detail about appropriate clothing.

Students can do their own laundry, and they have a designated laundry day in their residence. The Head of House in each residence arranges this. Students' days are very busy, however, and there is an excellent weekly laundry service available for boarding students that are highly recommend. The laundry service can be billed to the student account.

NOTE: Anything your child needs at school can be bought in Geneva. Whenever possible, try to make sure your child has everything she/he needs **before** you make your final farewells. It is also important to take note that the voltage in Switzerland is 220V. Some appliances coming from other countries may not work.
